ARCHIVAL ACTIVITIES

We cannot thank the Wellington County Archives enough for their generosity and patience in allowing the Esquesing Historical Society Archives to be stored in their excellent facilities for the

duration of the construction. We were ensconced in our new facilities by May. The move was made by Society volunteers Karen & Rick Hunter, Ray Denny, Rob Burnett, Mark Rowe, Walter Lewis and Mike Harley.

We did not employ a summer student in 2013 as we needed to get the Archives organized and we needed to catch up with the processing of the many wonderful donations we received last year and this year. Some of the highlights include an oil painting of Col. John R. Barber and numerous photographs from all parts of the township. The *Independent Free Press* brought over about 60 bound copies of their past issues after they moved to smaller premises, as well as the last of their printed photographs. The expanded shelving space in the Archives has been put to very good use. The best publicized highlight was the acquisition of a well-preserved quilt sent to the Shornecliffe Military Hospital in England in 1915 by the Women's Institute of Georgetown. The display in the Library in November attracted quite a lot of attention.

WEBSITE USE – esquesinghistorical society.ca

Our website had 18 644 visits over the past year, a decrease of 2356 visits over last year. This averages out to 51.08 visits a day. These visits originated from Canada, the United States, Ukraine, China, Germany, Congo, Japan, Russia, France and Great Britain. The unique visitors to the site (once only) were 46%, compared to last year's 76% suggesting more extensive use of the site.

Besides searching for EHS directly, the most popular search phrases were Speyside, Glen Williams, Esquesing, Ballinafad, EHS archives, Halton Hills HS, Limehouse, newspaper articles, Acton and Georgetown.

Web pages accessed on our website in order of popularity were Communities – Speyside, the newspaper articles, About Us, Archives, Heritage Halton Hills, EHS executive, EHS meetings and Links.

There were 308 downloads from the site, for our book list. Next in popularity was the May 2010 newsletter, Kennedy Family files, the Archival Table of Contents, The 1913 *Georgetown Herald*, newsletters for Sept. 2012, Sept. 2009, and Jan. 2012 and the 1893 *Toronto Daily Mail*. These were the same items of interest as last year, except for the newsletters.

The most popular month to visit was December (October), while March was the slowest. Daily visits averaged about 2600 visits for each of the seven days of the week. Tuesday won by a slight margin (2818).
