ARCHIVAL ACTIVITIES

The first three newsletters in 2021, for the EHS mentioned the library lockdown. As expected, we had little use of the facilities this year. However, behind the scenes, work carried on. Last year, Mohawk College approached the EHS about using their Library Technician Diploma students to work remotely for the EHS. This would qualify as a *bona fide* placement, towards completing their diploma. Mary Baxter was the first student and the program was deemed a success. She was followed by Sarah Hughes, Krista Harkins, Kate Sims and Christine McLean. Currently Darlene Anson is working remotely for the EHS. The vast majority of their work has been adding images from our collection to Halton Hills Images. As the statistics below show, they have added 1103 new images to our on-line collection.

Heritage Halton Hills continued their partnership with the EHS this summer, using the Archives as a base for student Kylie Robin. She added an on-line presentation on The Williams Mill, Glen Williams to the "Let's Talk Halton Hills" page of the Town Website. The EHS is pleased to continue our partnership in providing images for use by Heritage Halton Hills in the *Independent Free Press*.

The Halton Hills Public Library graciously allowed two films related to the Archives, to be made in the History Room. Humber College film students Parker Weames and Nick Mongillo brought an entire crew to interview Archivist John Mark Rowe on the Barber Paper Mills for their school assignment. The second film was an interview on the 90th anniversary of the Acton Royal Canadian Legion. Melissa Candelaria of YourTV Halton, the local channel for Cogeco Cable, interviewed Archivist Rowe about the history and the resources contained in the Archives. Both interviews included shots in the Archives. The Legion piece aired on Cogeco in November. We haven't heard how the Humber College assignment went.

The EHS Archives is pleased to once again have the support of Halton Hills Public Library in offering the scan the latest donation of 14 Tweedsmuir Histories by the Ashgrove Women's Institute. As these books are scanned, they will be posted to Halton Hills Images, providing an invaluable source of history to the public, while preserving the originals in our Archives. Ashgrove joins books from Georgetown, Acton, Dublin, Esquesing, Terra Cotta and Limehouse on the internet. The Archives also holds records from Halton, Bannockburn, Norval, Silver-Wood and Hornby.

This year we had about 1200 users compared to almost 3000 last year. The most popular website pages visited were Halton Images, Contact Us, Meetings & Events, Publications, Newsletters, Georgetown Street Names, Communities. Down 10% from last year, 65% of visitors were from Canada, followed by 15% from China, 11% from the USA and 4% from the United Kingdom.

The average number of visits was 100 per month with October and November being most popular but there was no traffic from January to April. This could be a problem with the Google Analytics program or because of COVID 19 lock downs, users were not checking the site. We were still in the "blurr days" of the pandemic.
